

DISTINGUISHING BETWEEN FORA ESCA RP AND ARMY CLEANUP PROGRAMS

FORA ESCA PROGRAM ELEMENTS

Nine parcels totaling 3,340 acres of the former Fort Ord

Parcels divided into four groups representing the order areas will be addressed

Responsible only for munitions cleanup

Distinct Community Involvement and Outreach Program (CIOP) to engage affected community members and local constituencies

Separate community meetings and presentations

Separate cleanup documentation and reports

ESCA RP cleanup decisions made separately

Secured funding for the cleanup of the ESCA parcels

If cleanup exceeds \$100 million, an environmental insurance policy will cover additional costs.

Coordination with local jurisdictions helps prioritize cleanups according to reuse schedules

Must meet all regulatory requirements governing a Superfund site

FORA has its own team of experts to analyze, investigate, and remediate munitions on the ESCA parcels

ARMY AND FORA COORDINATION

Community Involvement Workshops

Technical Review Committee Meetings

Participation in semi-annual Army Bus Tours

Coordinated information distribution

Synchronization of regulatory document submittal

Timing of field work for both programs

ARMY RESPONSIBILITIES

Statutory responsibility for cleanup over the entire former Fort Ord property

Continuing responsibility for groundwater cleanup, monitoring and maintenance of landfill and soil remediation

Responsibility for all MEC cleanup OUTSIDE the ESCA parcels - including BLM properties and the Inland Range

Base wide Community Relations Plan

Must meet all regulatory requirements governing a Superfund site
